

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There are persistent differences in the achievement of girls and boys in education. In 2014 the performance gap between boys and girls treats its widest ever -6.7 percentage points, at the top grades of A* and A. Sociologists argue that a whole range of factors can explain this gap both in school and within wider society. Gorard noted that when coursework was introduced in 1988 the gap between boys and girls widened with girls outperforming boys in more subject areas, however this could be linked to changes in wider society as much as it is to the introduction of coursework.
